Year 11 worked in Humanities for the day revising, planning and getting ready for all things History, Geography and RE related.



MLP Engineering Challenge Day



On Wednesday, 9th February 2022, a crack team of Year 9 future designers travelled to Trafalgar School to compete in the first MLP Engineering challenge.

Details of the challenge were a closely guarded secret, all they knew was that they would be competing against teams from Trafalgar and Wyvern St. Edmunds.

"It is great to be able to get out and represent the Academy in this kind of event" said Mr Humphrey "it gives the students an opportunity to experience Design & Technology in a different environment."

There were two timed challenges. The first to build a rubber band powered race car and see which team could travel the furthest and the second to build a wind turbine that could generate electricity.

The guest judges from DSTL (The Defence Science and Technology Laboratory in Porton Down) said they were impressed by the ingenuity and teamwork that our students displayed during the two challenges and went on to express how valuable these skills were in industry as companies like DSTL look to recruit innovative thinkers, good communicators and problem solvers to help shape the future.

Mr Humphrey said "I am very proud of the way the team (Megan, Jacob, Christian and Zeba) worked together to create two fantastic working prototypes in such a short space of time. They had a great time and were a real credit to the Academy."

COVID Clinics

The School Age Immunisation Team have requested the following information is shared with parents. They aware that several of the 12-15 cohort are reaching eligibility for their 1st or 2nd Covid vaccination at different times and therefore may not be able to receive their vaccination when the Immunisation Team visit our school. NHS England are keen to ensure that all children have the opportunity to receive their 1st or 2nd dose as soon as possible after they become eligible. Therefore, the vaccination centres have increased their capacity of this age group over the half term to accommodate this. If you would like to have your child vaccinated with either the 1st or 2nd dose of Covid-19 vaccination please book an appointment using the national booking system Book or manage a coronavirus (COVID-19) vaccination - NHS (www.nhs.uk) or by calling 119. If you would prefer to 'walk-in', sessions accepting walk-in's can be identified via the 'grab a jab' website Find a walk-in coronavirus (COVID-19) vaccination site - NHS (www.nhs.uk)

Please note for both doses your child needs to be 12 weeks since a positive Covid test, that there is a 12 week gap between the 1st and 2nd doses.

Wiltshire Council Trading Standards

The Academy has received the following information from the Wiltshire Council Trading Standards. Could all parents please be aware of the following and speak with your children.

Wiltshire Council Trading Standards have received a report from a parent of a 13 year old student stating that her daughter has been able to purchase ecigarettes, vaping products or puff bars at a market stall at Salisbury Market, mostly on Saturdays. It seems that she has been able to make these purchases on multiple occasions. No ID check has been made by the trader.

The trader has been advised and spoken to by an officer from Trading Standards. However, trading standards would ask that all parents/carers check with their children to see if any purchases have been made at all. This trader has potentially committed a criminal offence by selling these items to persons under 18 years of age.
