Cultural Capital

The Extended Learning Day in Art provided a fantastic opportunity for Year 9 students to experience a whole range of new techniques and skills. There were 5 workshops of an hour long which all the students visited in turn.

The first workshop was led by Katy England from Salisbury Museum who introduced the students to the extensive fashion collection and how artists and designers have a responsibility to sustainability in fashion. This then inspired the making of a newspaper dress based on historic sources and ideas about how students could re-purpose garments.

In the second workshop visiting artist Sam Perry, who has previously worked and exhibited at some of the biggest London galleries, worked with our students to create a Surrealist inspired head.

Workshop 3 was led by Miss Shields who introduced the students to embroidery and they created their own bespoke badges.

In workshop 4 Mrs Millidge, helped the students weave with recycled clothes onto scrap bike wheels, all donated by the Trussell Trust and Rise:61's bike hub. These will eventually be installed around the school on fences.

The last workshop was paper shoe making with Mr Humphrey which completes our head to toe fashion and textile ELD.

Apprenticeship Fair

Featuring over 30 employers including Trethowans Solicitors, QinetiQ, DSTL, Wiltshire Council and many more, students were able to explore what apprenticeships were available in the local area, as well as the skills they needed to access them. Featuring an apprenticeships Blind Date, students had a brilliant time and feedback from them has been universally positive with a number of students identifying employers they would like to apply to either after Year 11 or Sixth Form. Very much hoping this becomes a regular occasion each year, huge thanks to the Salisbury Education Partnership and all the employers for arranging such an incredibly useful event.

MLP Engineering Challenge Day



On Wednesday, 8th February a squad of talented Year 9 design engineers travelled to the Trafalgar School to participate in the annual MLP Engineering challenge.

Two mixed teams of four competed against teams from Trafalgar and Wyvern St. Edmunds in two challenges that tested their problem solving ability and creativity.

"It is a great to be able to get out and represent the academy in a different kind of event," said Mr Humphrey, "it gives the students an opportunity to experience Design and Technology in a different environment".

The teams were each given an identical box of resources (including strips of timber, paper straws, lolly sticks and bamboo skewers) together with a glue gun and a craft knife. They were then challenged to create a wind turbine that could actually generate electricity and a lightweight bridge structure that could span a 40cm gap and support a 3kg weight.

MLP Director of Education Mr Curtis visited and was impressed by the ingenuity and teamwork that our students displayed during the two challenges.

Mr Humphrey said, "I am very proud of the way the squad (Callum Dixey, George Kay, Daria Sadik, Melyssa Wakefield, Felicity Corson, Chloe-Hope Judd, Sienna Bradley and Evelyn Witt) worked together to create two fantastic working prototypes in such a short space of time. They demonstrated their ability to think innovatively, communicate well and work as teams. The students had a great time and were a real credit to the Academy".

New Age Kurling


