

Dear Parents

I am delighted that the Prime Minister Boris Johnson has made the announcement that all students can return to school from Monday 8th March, we will be very happy when, as a school community, we can be fully together again. Remote learning will continue to be set until your child is back in school.

Safety in school

When students return to school we will, of course, have control measures in place and will continue to have a culture of regular hand sanitising.

Additional support measures from the Department of Education now include testing and the increased use of face coverings. Each student will receive three covid-19 lateral flow tests over the first two weeks back. All staff are already having tests twice a week. You will have already received a link to provide consent for this and I would encourage you to complete this as soon as possible. https://forms.gle/uRgS1aZsMtkXLJ4v6

After the three initial tests we have testing kits for students to complete at home and will provide more guidance about this nearer the time.

Face coverings

Face coverings have been in use in corridors since September and as an additional measure, for a limited time, the Department for Education have introduced that all students should also wear face coverings in lessons. Students should therefore wear their face coverings at all times in the building except when they are eating.

Fortunately, the weather is much improved and we will encourage all students to go outside at break and lunchtime when they can remove their face covering and enjoy the fresh air.

We would like all students (except those with exemption lanyards) to have cloth face coverings as the disposable face coverings are not designed for extensive wearing throughout the day and can break easily.

Return dates and testing

In order that we can have a settled return on the first day and so children are less worried about the tests, we would like students to come into school the day before they return for their first covid test.

We understand that students may well be anxious or nervous about taking a test, especially if they haven't been tested before. Please show them the attached guide for how they will take a test. The testing team will be here to help guide them on the day as well. Next week we will also put together a video of the testing hall to reassure students and show them the process. Mrs Steggel and Mrs Leyland are both members of the testing team and will take care of any student who finds it tricky.

Test results will be provided directly to parents mobile phones so there will be no need to wait for the test result and students do not need to be in uniform.

All covid tests are taking place in the sports hall and students should enter school via the PE entrance, they will then exit via the sports hall and go round the side to leave the Academy.

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Students will not need to enter the rest of the Academy on that first day when they are being tested.
