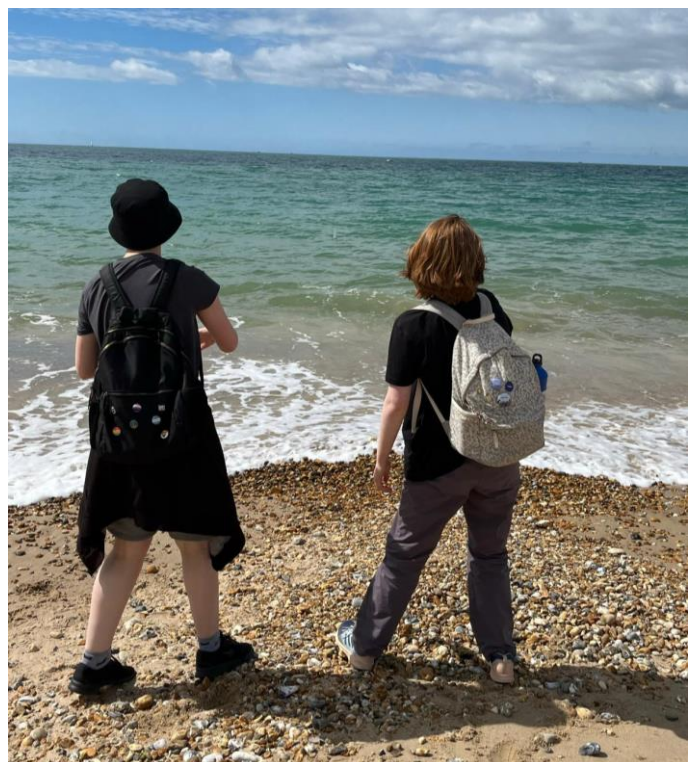
Year 9 did a local walk with the science department, looking at local nature, ecology and the environment, walking from Lizzie Gardens in town to Clarendon place.

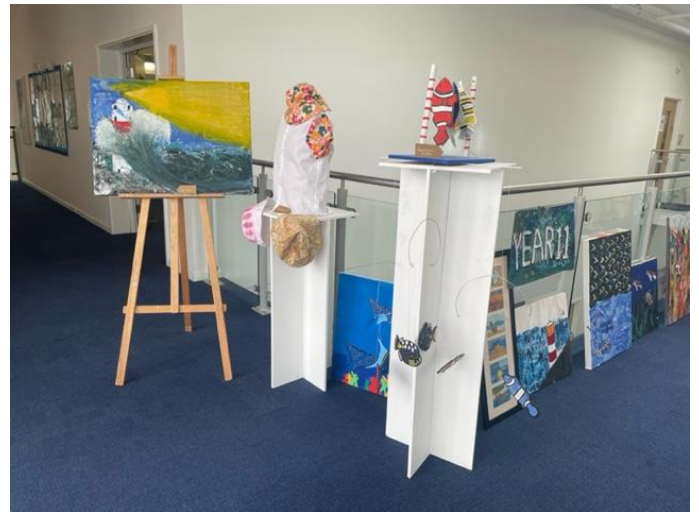
# Art Exhibition 2022

A special thank you goes to our Year 12 and 13 professional cookery students who provided an exceptional array of canapés for the evening.







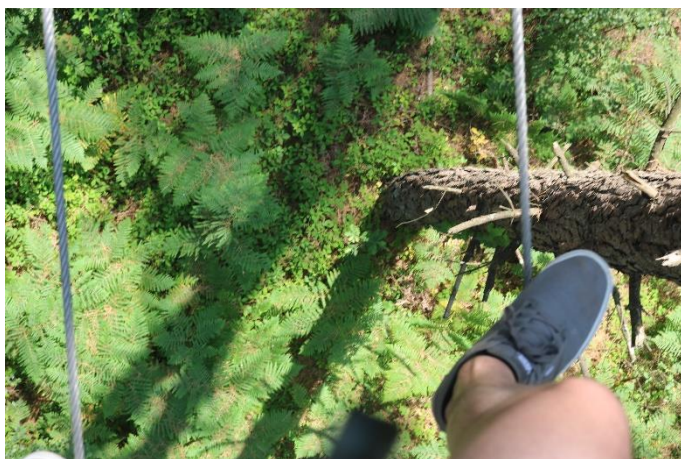
# Activities Week

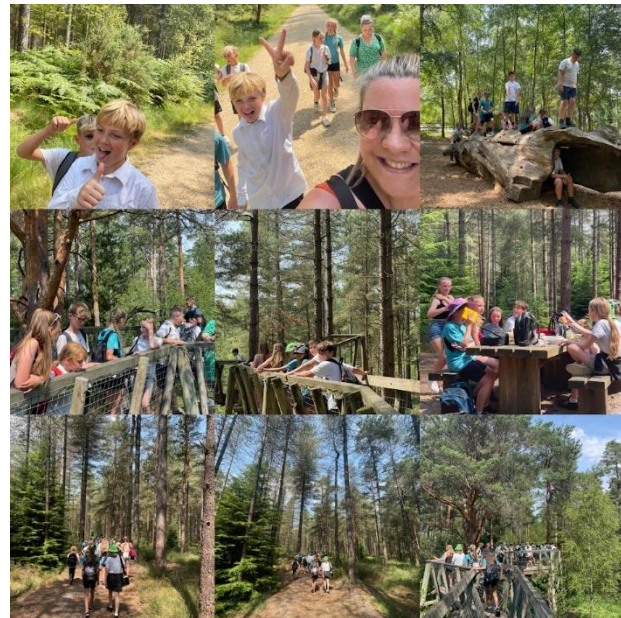

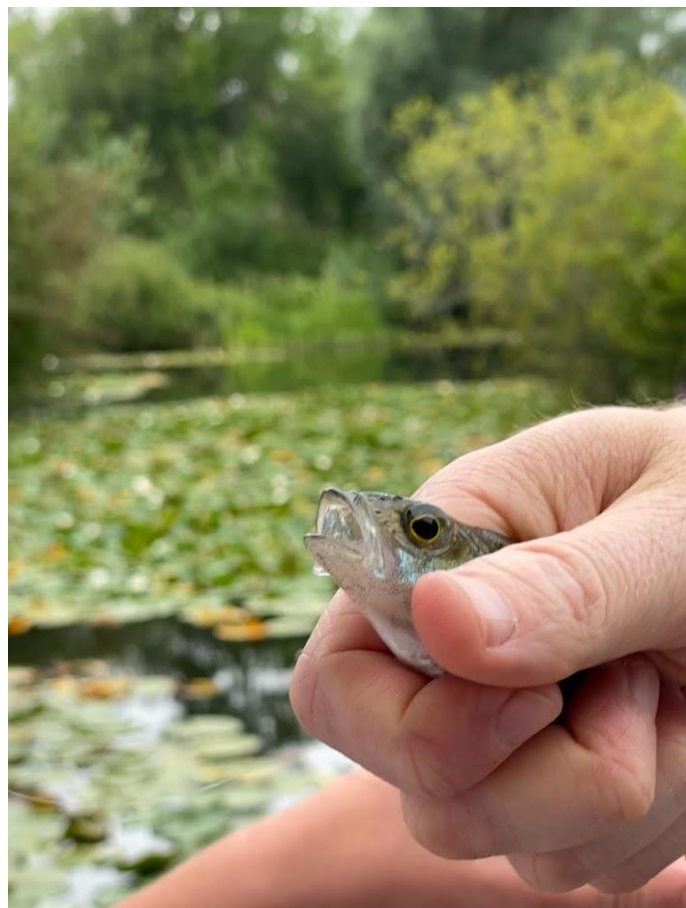
