# **Stone Masons Workshop**



Sarum Academy BTEC and A Level Art students had the unique and prestigious opportunity to work with the Stonemasons of Salisbury Cathedral. Salisbury Cathedral is one of only nine Cathedrals to have its own stone yard and dedicated Stonemasons. The enormity of their responsibility dominates the Salisbury skyline for us all to see. Students were greeted in the cloisters for a draughty briefing on the day ahead. Sleep still apparent in the ever widening eyes of our students as they were told of the days promise. Students were able to work in small groups to carve using ancient techniques, hand tools and letter carving methods passed down through generations of hands. The students used simple tools to work the stone and form letter forms, a simple task you may think, however, this took a steady hand, a delicate approach and resilience. The stone was cold and seemingly resistant to our will. After patience and application all students were able to carve letter forms; a skill the stonemasons all prize and refine to leave their signature on any stone they carve.

Our hosts allowed us unprecedented access to the Cathedral with tours and vertiginous views of the cathedral from the balcony, a really special occasion for us all. The Cathedral staff were knowledgeable and were excellent hosts, we all had an amazing experience that will have a lifelong impact on our students, of that I am confident. Our thanks go to Salisbury Cathedral Education Team, Stonemasons and Tours guides. They made our day.
